 - A. To be used in gas chromatographs for air sample analysis.
 - For use in laboratory testing of nuclear grade activated carbon for radiolodine penetration in accordance with ASTM D3803-89 and NCS Procedure 178.
 - Trace contaminants contained in carbon samples and equipment.

CONDITIONS

- 10. Licensed material may only be used at the licensee's facilities located at:
 - A. 1385 W. Goodale Boulevard, Columbus, Ohio 43212
 - B. Licensed material listed in Item 6.C. may also be used at temporary job sites in the State of Ohio.
- 11. The Radiation Safety Officer for this license is:
 - A. John R. Pearson
- Licensed material shall be used by, or under the supervision of, John R. Pearson, Charles C. Myers, John R. Hunt, or Kevin M. Fleming.
- 13. Sealed sources containing licensed material shall not be opened or sources removed from source holders by the licensee.
- 14. Maintenance, repair, cleaning, replacement, and disposal of foils contained in detector cells shall be performed only by the device manufacturer or other persons specifically licensed by Director, NRC or an Agreement State to perform such services.
- 15. The licensee shall conduct a physical inventory every 6 months to account for all licensed material received and possessed under the license. Records of inventories shall be maintained for 3 years from the date of each inventory, and shall include the quantities and kinds of byproduct material, manufacturer's name and model numbers, location of the sources and/or devices, and the date of the inventory.
- 16. Except as otherwise specified in this license, the licensee shall have available and follow the instructions contained in the manufacturer's instruction manual for the chromatography device.

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SUPPLEMENTARY SHEET

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- 17. Licensed material shall not be used in or on human beings.
- 18. The licensee may transport licensed material in accordance with the provisions of OAC 3701:1-50.
- 19. In addition to the possession limits in item 8, the licensee shall further restrict the possession of sealed source licensed materials to quantities below the minimum limit specified in OAC 3701:1-40-17 for establishing decommissioning financial assurance.
- The licensee is authorized to dispose of licensed radioactive material only in accordance with OAC 3701:1-38-19.
- 21. Except as specifically provided otherwise in this license, the licensee shall conduct its program in accordance with the statements, representations, and procedures contained in the documents, including any enclosures, listed below. The Ohio Department of Health's statutes, rules, and orders shall govern unless statements, representations, and procedures in the licensee's application and correspondence are more restrictive than the regulations.
